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### MEDIA LITERACY: STORY THROUGH PHOTOS


#### **ACP Loves Kids!**

We are so pleased to be working with Young Audiences of Woodruff Arts Center and Showcase to put cameras in the hands of middle school kids so they can learn how to communicate ideas with images through the program: Media Literacy: Story Through Photos.

This year, we are proud to be part of a groundbreaking project at **Scot**tish Rite and Egleston Children's hospitals. A small team of volunteers, led by Corinne Adams, has been discussing portraiture with teen groups at the hospitals. The teens then make self-portraits and collaborate on portrait ideas while photographing each other. This outlet for expression has proved to be transformative for these inpatient teens. You can see for yourself at the exhibition of this work on November 1st at the High Museum of Art (see page 40 for more info). Thanks also to Bill Boling, Morris Martin & Manning and Showcase being so integral to the success of this program.

For the last three years, ACP has conducted a Spring High School Essay **Contest** with Atlanta Public Schools. In their essays, students answer the question If you could photograph anything in your world, what would you photograph, and why? # Joel Sternfeld

BEHIND THE LENS WITH THIS YEAR'S KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Throughout the month of October, the Atlanta Celebrates Photography (ACP) Festival will transform the city into a nexus of contemporary photography through citywide installations, featuring the work of nearly 1,000 artists at a multitude of venues. In a coordinated effort between ACP and the High Museum of Art, world-renowned photographer Joel Sternfeld will deliver the keynote lecture for the 2012 festival. A seminal figure in the field of modern photography,

Sternfeld has been one of the discipline's most enduring practitioners, with a body of work that spans nearly 40 years. His cinematic vistas and achingly poignant portraiture have captured our nation's aspirations, pastimes, joys and tragedies—both urban and rural. In its revelation of the uniquely American sociocultural experiment, his photography

often conveys a snapshot-like quality of serendipity that belies his studied compositions and skillful use of color.

"Sternfeld is considered one of the most important and influential photographers in America, particularly for his work in large-format color photography," says Brett Abbott, curator of photography for the High Museum of Art. "Both the High's photography program and the ACP festival have really taken

off in recent years. I can't think of a better way for us to kick off the 2012 celebration than with this fantastic opportunity to hear from one of the legends in our field."

Sternfeld's address at the High's Hill Auditorium on Thursday, September 27, at 7 p.m. should offer some insight into his development as a photographer and some keen observations about the trajectory of modern photography in general. His participation in the ACP festival will help to educate and engage audiences, while supporting Atlanta's emergence as an international center for photography. —*Christina Cotter*

# **Jan Banning**

POIGNANT PORTRAITURE SPEAKS TO THE PLIGHT OF THE HOMELESS

In a fascinating array of projects Dutch photographer Jan Banning has trained his camera on diverse communities around the world, often with an emphasis on how war, power dynamics and conflict register in human terms. He has documented the Indonesian girls—now elderly women—forced into prostitution by Japanese soldiers during World War II in "Comfort Women." In searing black and white images he has captured the heartbreak of a new generation of Vietnamese maimed by exposure to the chemical defoliant Agent Orange in "Children of the White Mist." And in his latest project "Down and Out in the South," the internationally exhibited photographer takes an exceptionally marginalized and misunderstood population as his subject: the homeless.

The project originated during an artist residency in Columbia, South Carolina, and the series has since expanded to Atlanta and the Mississippi Delta.







"I realized that homelessness is not the most original theme for a photographer," admits Banning. "However I felt I could add a new dimension by portraying these people not as what they are: homeless, with all visual references of destitution that society associates with that such as back packs, shopping carts, tents and sleeping bags, etcetera, but by focusing on who they are."

While Banning is not the first to photograph modern society's pariahs, his approach to documenting the home-

less is extraordinary. Rather than the expected treatment of a marginalized population, Banning takes a more artful approach reminiscent of the tender. humanity-infused 17th-century Dutch oil painting of Johannes Vermeer and Frans Hals. As in his portraits of the victims of war. Banning focuses on people who wear some chronicle of their pain on their faces. But Banning builds their identity back up in his soulful portraits. The images are arresting: His subjects' eyes glow with a glittering brightness that contrasts with the worn, marred patina of their skin; we confront them as individuals rather than a marginalized group. Separated from the streets and photographed in a studio, Banning confers a serenity on people who we normally try desperately not to contemplate. As the artist puts it. "I hope this will contribute to a better understanding of the fate of the homeless." —Felicia Feaster

# **Brian Ulrich**

DOCUMENTING THE AGE OF EXCESS

From 2001 to 2011. Brian Ulrich documented a remarkable decade in American consumerist excess in the three-part "Copia" series, published by Aperture as Is This Place Great or What. "Retail" gathers up revealing moments, mostly comic, in the history of big-box store shopping, from distracted patrons on an escalator to boxed crucifixes stacked next to stuffed animals. and discounted war toys. "Thrift" follows the trail of this flood of mass-market goods into the thrift stores where discards go to die or be resold. Here the portrayal is mostly poignant: Ulrich focuses on randomly arranged goods, downscale shopping transactions and employees faced with organizing the incoming products. "Dark Stores," begun after the 2008 economic collapse, is elegiac: Gutted spaces and completely empty shopping malls become Ulrich's metaphor for the discontents of an entire commercial way of life.



These are three significantly different approaches to documentary photography. "Retail" represents Ulrich looking for spaces in Midwestern malls where interesting events were likely to happen. "Thrift" seeks out significant moments behind the scenes. "Dark Stores" discovers the poetry of contemporary ruins. The three combine into a diverse narrative that captures a complex phenomenon in ways that creatively transform conventional documentary approaches. —Jerry Cullum

# **Geolocation: Atlanta**

ACP PUBLIC ART PROJECT PRESENTS ARCHIVISTS OF THE DIGITAL AGE

Every day, every hour, sometimes every minute, people share the most personal and private dimensions of their lives on social media. From Twitter to Facebook, social media has become the place where we broadcast our anxieties, hopes, fears and boredom. Life has never been so simultaneously public and private. Artists Nate Larson and Marni Shindelman explore that strange modern dichotomy. "I think that it's amazing to be able to maintain a low level of contact with a lot of people," says Larson.

Baltimore-based Larson and recent Athens, Georgia transplant Shindelman have sought to explore the ramifications of this sort of over-sharing—more than 300 million status updates a day served up on Twitter—in their *Geolocation: Atlanta* project for ACP. The tweets they capture offer both moments of insight and existential searching, juxtaposed with images of the city that can range from the banal to the evocative. "One thing I've come to recognize is you can't assume your feelings are more profound than that of others. Everyone feels. Differently," offers one anonymous Atlanta tweeter.

gible, physical dimension to what can seem like vaporous thoughts floating out there on the Internet. "There is a digital noise surrounding us, invisible chatter, and Nate and I spend time listening to this in each city we travel to. These photographs then act as a means of memorializing these brief, virtual moments," says Shindelman.

"We see ourselves as archivists, pulling down and preserving a small fragment of them that would otherwise be lost to the vastness of the Internet," offers Larson. "In some ways, it's similar to a historic plaque for a battle on the side of the highway—a marker speaking of the history of place."

And the work itself is often surprisingly poignant, melancholy even.
Rather than random, untethered thoughts pulsing through cyberspace, Larson and Shindelman ground "geolocation" in lived reality and the messy, sad, complex truth of ordinary people's lives. The artists rightly call them "anonymous tributes to anonymous people." —Felicia Feaster

#### Art in the Digital Culture . . . Threat or Opportunity?

In this, the sixth installment of the Lumière fall lecture series, Shannon Perich of the Smithsonian Institution and Irfan Essa of the Georgia Institute of Technology will each speak to the future of art in a rapidly expanding digital culture. #### **LECTURE**

#### Thu, Sep 27, 7 pm

From the beginnings of color photography as an artistic medium, Joel Sternfeld has been one of the field's most influential and enduring practitioners. With a career spanning nearly 40 years, Sternfeld's work continues to inspire each successive generation of photographers when they load sheets of film into their view cameras.

Available in classic photobooks like *American Prospects, Stranger Passing*, and *On This Site*, Sternfeld's work shines a keen eye on America's visual (im) possibilities, from the grand gesture of the Space Shuttle piggybacking a jumbo jet to the quiet street portrait of a woman wearing a pink suit carrying a caged bunny. Sternfeld's eye has the omniscience of someone who's clearly seeing everything at once, and yet knows exactly where to place his tripod to capture what the rest of us wouldn't be able to imagine.

Yet Sternfeld's fascinations don't remain in the ironic. His investigations of nature (Oxbow Archive) and the High Line before it became the "High Line" reveal an artist in touch with nearly every aspect of what makes America America: the uniqueness of its people, the fragility of nature in the face of the built environment, and how the past consistently reveals (and underscores) the present.

Brian Ulrich's work came to prominence through "Copia," an ongoing, long-term study of American commerce that first focused on shoppers in retail big-box stores in the wake of 9/11. While President Bush's urging that Americans "go shopping" to help America recover from the terrorist attack may have been more myth than fact, Ulrich's work dives straight to the heart of American mythmaking: that a perfect, utopian future is purchasable.

His work examines vacated shopping malls ("Retail"), retail establishments abandoned in the wake of the financial crisis ("Dark Stores"), and how the retail ecosystem recycles itself in second-hand stores ("Thrift"). While taking a conceptual approach to examining how buying and selling is at the root of the American ethos, Ulrich's approach is substantively aligned with his photo-documentarian forbearers. Ulrich's Dead Mall's might as well be our decade's dust bowl, and by illuminating their haunting presence, Ulrich reveals the cracks in the thinnest of facades, and that freedom isn't free, it's On Sale now!

His 2011 book from Aperture, Is This Place Great or What combines all three projects into a cohesive whole. Ulrich currently teaches at Virginia Commonwealth University in Richmond, VA.



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
