ACP is pleased to announce that Atlanta-based photographer and artist Beth Lilly has been selected by a panel of jurors to create ACP's Public Art Project for ACP 11. Her project, "Gifted", will engage the public and transform Atlanta through the gift of 1,200 limited-edition, fine art photographs which will be distributed to the public for free during the month of October.

Beth Lilly has curated a collection of twelve photographs from participating local photographers and with oversight from the artists, created limited-edition prints (100 of each photograph, totaling 1200 prints). These artworks will be handed out free, as gifts to the public, throughout the Atlanta metro region during the ACP festival in October, in unexpected places, at unannounced times. The dates and locations for obtaining a free print will not be disclosed in advance (but you may want to keep an eye on twitter [www.twitter.com/acp11] to find out when the Gifted team hits the street).

Selected from a competitive open call for proposals, "Gifted" will infuse Atlanta with photography in

an exciting, unpredictable way that directly impacts Atlantans within the flow of their daily lives. Lilly's project is poised to find and cultivate new appreciators of photography and the photographic print. The exchange will promote local photographers while encouraging a rich dialogue about the act of gifting valuable art for free, as well as providing an oblique commentary on the current economy.

ACP LECTURE SERIES

Artist Lecture: Vincent Laforet

Wednesday, October 7th, at 7pm

At the age of 34, Vincent Laforet's work has been published in most major publications around the world, and he has been sent on assignment by Vanity Fair, The New York Times Magazine, National Geographic, Sports Illustrated, Time, Newsweek, and Life Magazine. Vincent's fine art prints are exhibited in galleries internationally including the International Center of Photography in New York City, and Visa Pour L'Image in Perpignan, and are part of numerous private collections. His approach to aerial photography has been singled out as one of the most unique and interpretive among photographers today. Vincent was recognized as one of the "100 Most Influential People in Photography" by American Photo Magazine in 2005 and was named one of the "30 photographers to watch under 30" by PDN in 2002. He and four other photographers were awarded the Pulitzer Prize in Feature Photography for their post-9/11 coverage overseas in 2002. Vincent is a Canon Explorer of Light and Canon Printmaster, and serves as consultant to companies such as Apple, Bogen, Lexar, and X-Rite. He and his work have been profiled on CNN and Good Morning America. Laforet has been invited as a keynote speaker

by a variety of organizations and universities from around the world. He has served as an adjunct professor at Columbia University's Graduate School of Journalism, and the International Center of Photography. Vincent is represented by the Stockland Martel Agency. He resides in Manhattan Beach, CA, with his wife, Amber, son, Noah, and daughter Eliana.

Vincent Laforet's lecture coincides with an exhibition of his work at Matre Gallery which opens on Thursday, October 8th at 6:30pm. Presented with Matre Gallery and SCAD- Atlanta.

Jeanne Dielman has long been recognized as a landmark work. Yet three decades after its release it has only now become available on DVD in America, and screenings in its original film format have been rare. As part of ACP 11, the Film Love series is proud to present a new 35mm print of this classic film that continues to surprise and haunt audiences today.

Brussels, 1975: a twenty-five-year-old director, a legendary actress, and a mostly female film crew produce a movie in five weeks at a minuscule cost. Its title consists only of the protagonist's name and street address. Almost every scene breaks cardinal rules of commercial cinema. Yet the enigmatic film has a powerful effect on audiences, and the rarity of its screenings only add to its mystique. Three decades later, *Jeanne Dielman, 23 Quai du Commerce, 1080 Bruxelles* is considered by many to be a masterpiece of world cinema and is voted one of the top twenty films of the twentieth century by the Village Voice. Rarely has there been a movie harder to describe than *Jeanne Dielman*, for the film's emotional power and psychological depth are ingeniously achieved through minimal onscreen action. Over the course of three days, as the details of Jeanne's routines accumulate, the film

draws us into an intense examination of her inner life - helped along by the brilliant cinematography of Babette Mangolte, the subtle clues in director Chantal Akerman's script, and a mesmerizing lead performance by Delphine Seyrig. But gradually, we see Jeanne's compulsively regular routine begin to break down, leading to a shocking conclusion. *Jeanne Dielman, 23 Quai du Commerce, 1080 Bruxelles* (dir. Chantal Akerman, 1975) 35mm, 201 minutes.

Jeanne Dielman is a Film Love event. The Film Love series provides access to rare but important films, and seeks to increase awareness of the rich history of experimental and avant-garde film. The series is curated and hosted by Andy Ditzler for Frequent Small Meals.

Renée Cox (b. 1960), a Jamaica-born, New York-based artist, is widely acclaimed for her photographic series that provoke, question, and challenge the multi-layered impact of sexism and racial prejudice. Cox, who was initially a fashion photographer, began garnering international attention in the mid-1990s when she began using her own body as the central figure in her work. Her large-format series often feature one of her alter-egos: Rajé, the larger than life superhero wearing a skintight costume with the colors of the Jamaican flag, or Mama, the nude central figure in the Yo Mama series. Through these bold protagonists she heightens the multiple dimensions of black womanhood. Additionally, she articulates her disdain for the ways that black people have traditionally been written out of art history, and articulates her deep concern and sometimes outrage for societal injustices.

This program is organized by the Spelman College Museum of Fine Art in partnership with Atlanta Celebrates Photography, the Spelman College Women's Research and Resource Center, and the High Museum of Art.
